1.1) Zero hunger

1.3) Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana

10 crore LPG connections have been provided.

1.6) Environment conservation

Afforestation programs and sustainable land management contribute to environmental conservation and generate employment opportunities.

1.8) Affordable and clean energy

National Solar Mission and Ujwal DISCOM Assurance yojana contribute clean energy

2. Explain the constitutional perspectives of gender justice, citing relevant constitutional provisions and case laws.

A. Gender justice in law is an idea that everyone regardless of gender, sex, sex orientation or gender identity should have equal rights and opportunities.

1. The constitutional provisions are as following.

1.1) Preamble

It ensures citizen of India regardless of gender has equal rights on the constitution.

1.2) Article-14 of the constitution states that everyone is equal before the law which shows gender justice.

1.3) Article-15(1) states that rights against discrimination on the basis of sex, race, religion or birth or place.

1.4) Article-15(3) empowers women and children to protect the equality in the nation.

1.5) Article-16 of the Indian Constitution states that equal opportunities of employment for all.

1.6) Article-21 states that Life or Personal Liberty is the fundamental right for all.

1.7) Article-39(a)
everyone regardless of gender, sex has rights for adequate means of livelihood.
